Queens Cove has been on a Boil Water Advisory since June 25, 2006. In addition to the water problem there are sewage problems as well. INAC has approved funding to provide residents with bottled water. We have purchased & delivered a new septic tank at a cost of over \$2,500 and we have the water line repair posted for a 4th time (see page 11). In addition, we have resubmitted a proposal to INAC for funding to conduct a Groundwater Investigation.

Families are coping under the circumstances and continue to live at home.

# Message from Elected Chief & Council

Chief and council have been working hard on the direction set by membership; w have been able to wind up Hecate as of July 31, 2006 and we are waiting for the fin 1 report from Ernst & Young who are responsible for liquidating Hecate. Ehattesaht; fully prepared to purchase the License Back from Hecate. If we are successful in puchasing the license back we will be Logging around 100,000 m3 per year we will to one of the biggest player's right up there with WFP who log's around 100 and 150,000m3 per year in our territory. Council will fight hard to ensure we are successful in getting our License Back; this will bring us jobs and a better economic base for Ehattesaht.

"We have been able to secure more land: the WFP Lease site including the office and all of the buildings"

Council are proud to let membership know that we were also successful in negotiations with Western Forest Products to get around 2 million dollars worth of substantial agreement that include things like:

- Heli logging Global pricing (that is in it self worth a big profit to Ehattesaht);
- a new Position for an Ehattesaht member to be our f/t Forestry Coordinator;
  - Land: the whole WFP Lease including the WFP office, all the building's and the Shop (which we can Rent out to get some income back to us).

I have been working hard using my contact with the BC government to transfer the lease to Reserve land. I have already had dinner with Minister of Aboriginal Affairs Tom Christenson and Minister of Lands and Agriculture Pat Bell. I was lucky to be able to spend several hours with these Ministers to have time to seek their support on the transfer. They both let me know that they support our cause as well as getting all our leases for our oyster farm all rolled into one to save huge costs on the leases. If we have any difficulty for the Transfer we will be seeking approval of membership to do this through Treaty Related Measures, we would need to get member approval than take it to NTC to get the NTC treaty table support. The next step would be to get the approval from the Federal Government, which we are already working on as soon as WFP's Lease is transferred to us. We obviously need more land to build on and this land is perfect for that; it is nice and flat and lots of available room to build for housing and of course we need a long house / Hall and possibly our own school down the road.

Council has worked hard on ensuring that we get food fish this year, we are high on the list with the First Nations Marine Society.

These are just a few but important things Council has been working on and being successful in accomplishing in just a short term, if we reported on everything we would have ten pages—no 12, I think this issue is 12 pages long..

Council is proud to say that we have never felt a more unified and strong people that we have become we can say this because of the Celebration of life that the youth put on in June and the Tic ka iikwink Games that Ehattesaht hosted we have never felt a more unified front of our people, we are proud to be Ehattesaht.

I would like to thank the Ehattesaht Administration and Volunteers for all the hard work they do. I would also to thank Councillors Dave Miller and Virgil John who are working hard for Ehattesaht. We have a good team environment at Ehattesaht Office.







#### RE: BOIL WATER ADVISORY - CONTAMINATED DRINKING WATER QUEENS COVE - CHENAKHINT I.R.#11

- 1. The analytical results of water samples collected on 21 & 22 June 2006 from residences of Martin John and Arnold John located in Queens Cove Chenakhint I.R. #11 for microbiological testing revealed the water is contaminated and are not in accordance with the latest edition of the Guidelines for Canadian Drinking Water Quality.
- Please notify your community members to boil their water for at least one minute prior to consumption. Water must be brought to a rolling boil and held there for at least one minute before it can be used. This also applies to water being used for: Cooking, Brushing Teeth, Washing Dishes, Washing Fruits and Vegetables, BATHING INFANTS, and other activities during which water maybe ingested.
- 3. The use of bottled water is an alternative to boiling. Please make sure this information reaches all users of the drinking water. There are a number of possible ways to disseminate the Boil Water Advisory information to the community, the most effective is to post signs in visible areas near public buildings such as Band Office, Stores, Community Health Centers, Recreational Areas and Schools.
- The Boil Water Advisory is effective immediately and should remain in effect until the results of further water samples indicate the water is safe to drinking.








