

Evenflo Announces Voluntary Safety Recall of Discovery Infant Car Seat and Provides Supplemental Fastener to Enhance Safety Performance VANDALIA, Ohio

February 1, 2008 - Evenflo today announced it is implementing a voluntary safety recall of its Discovery Infant Car Seat Models 390, 391, 534, 552. Approximately one million units were produced beginning April 2005. This is based on recent laboratory tests conducted by Evenflo and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, which show that this car seat could potentially become separated from its base in high impact side collisions similar to those in the tests. As a precautionary measure, Evenflo is providing current owners of these models with a free supplemental dual-hook fastener that has proven that the seat remains attached to the base in the event of such collisions. Additionally, Evenflo is taking steps to

develop future models of Discovery with enhanced safety performance. These new Discovery models will be available to consumers starting in the second quarter, 2008.

Report from Chief & Council

Report from Chief Fred Adams

Happy New Year, I hope you all had a safe and happy holiday. Since the last report, December, I attended a meeting along with Virgil about the school situation there has been few changes over there. We expressed to them that our children 's education is of utmost importance to Ehattesaht. After the meeting, I took my family to Ahousaht to be with the rest of our family.

On returning, I was saddened to hear the passing of June Brown. I attended the funeral on behalf of council and invited her children and siblings to come home to reconnect with family over here. Condolences go out to the Brown family for the loss of June.

There was a unity gathering at the Village hall, I encourage members to attend these functions. The M.C.F.D child and youth mental health is the driving force behind this gathering, they are looking at ways to help the youth address issues they need help with. Michelle Thierren and Rayna Bates are the facilitators. We have also accessed a D&A councillor for the youth, please use, if you feel you need to talk to someone about substance abuse problems, His name is Peter Carter. I attended a three-day "Child At The Centre" forum in Vancouver All for our children! The forum focussed mainly on administration stuff until the last day. The NTC delegation made a statement that our children are most important to us and we need to keep our authority in caring for them! I have been talking to NTC to access services for our members living in town. There has been a commitment from the Supervisors so listen out!

I attended a litigation steering committee meeting in Port Alberni directors meeting in Tofino, a Wildlife meeting in Campbell River where I told the Wildlife people that Ehattesaht needed to have a seat on their helicopter when they do an Elk count in our territory. They committed a seat for us.

The same week I attended the Uu-a-thluk meetings in Port for a day, really interesting work being done.

The fisheries litigation is back at the front, we are in court to keep our right to fish and sell our fish. This is a very important case as is will affect future generations right to harvesting sea resources.

The funding agreement with INAC is also keeping me busy. I 'm proud to inform membership that the staff is ahead in keeping up with stuff needed to keep our moneys flowing.

We are negotiating now with Synex Energy about a Green Hydro project at Barr Creek. The numbers look good for us, we will be taking it to membership in the very near future.

Mike Rodger from NTC has been helping in negotiating referral deals, with our input, for us. The Hydro project being one of them. We have also been working at getting a head lease for the Yellow bluff to Kapoose Area so we have full authority on what goes on in our territory.

I am leaving to Vancouver to attend an Economic Development forum to take learn of any opportunities available to us. In closing Chief And council has been getting verbal reports of partying on the reserve and would like to remind membership of a motion passed on July 26 - 27th meeting:

That all Ehattesaht reserves are alcohol and drug free (illegal drugs) zones.

Individuals will be asked to leave the Ehattesaht territory for a period of six months or until they are rehabilitated.

Furthermore, that the people give direction to the Chief and Council to proceed with research to create and implement this bylaw. 23 in favour 1 against 2 abstain motion carried.

Please be advised that your council is working at providing a safe environment for our children to grow in.

People from Ehattesaht Needed for Community Development Initiative

The Aboriginal Leadership Initiative is a multi-sectoral project set to take place in Ehattesaht, Tseshaht, and Ahousaht. The Initiative goals are to develop an economic and a social development project in each of the three communities by building leadership capacity, and building relationships with representatives from corporations, non-profit organizations, and government.

Four people are needed from Ehattesaht to bring their energy to the Initiative. It is hoped one elder will be able to participate to bring their wisdom and guidance. The other people should be go-getters who will be able to involve other people from the community. The Initiative also hopes one of these will be a young person who will be paid a modest stipend to be coordinator and documentor of the Initiative for the next year.

Initiative staff met with Chief Fred Adams in Tseshaht on January 31 to brief him on the Initiative and to answer his questions. Chief Adams said he hoped one person from each of the communities' four houses will be able to participate.

There is a great opportunity through working on these projects to build skills and capacity. The working sessions with facilitators will include work on communication, leadership, conflict resolution, decision-making, management, and many other skills. Work with non-community partners will involve joint venturing, finding new opportunities, being understood, having Nuu-chah-nulth culture valued, and finding ways to communicate that make all this easier.

Aboriginal Leadership Initiative Schedule of Activities

February 18-20, 2008 — Integration Session 1

Skill Development and Relationship Building

Members of the three communities will come to Tseshaht for this Integration Session, where the focus will be on capacity building, orientation and design of the way forward. This session will prepare five or six participants from each community, and the corporate partners, to play an effective role in project development over the following months.

March 2008 — Community Dialogues 1

Developing Community Visions

The goal of these Community Dialogues is to capture the vision of the community members. The entire community will be invited to an evening event with dinner. A short video presentation will be developed with interviews of the communities' youth speaking on how they would like to experience their community in 50 years. Dialogue will be encouraged. The youth may choose a different presentation medium to communicate their vision.

The morning after the Community Dialogue, Initiative staff will request a meeting with the Chief and Council.

Working Session 1

April 2008 — Building Working Teams

Two to three weeks after the Community Dialogue, a **Working Session** will involve community members who are interested in developing their skills and leadership further and who wish to work on the Community Action Projects. Each community will select two major projects to address identified concerns. Integration Session 2

September 2008 — Learning from Each Other's Experience

In the second **Integration Session**, Initiative participants and partners will review what is working and where there are gaps or obstacles. By sharing what has happened in each of the three communities, it will be possible to identify strategies that are broader and more likely to be effective in other communities. This will also be an opportunity for further skill development in leadership, facilitation, and process design.

Community Dialogues 2

January 2009 — Review and Celebrate

Early next year meetings will be held in each community. Visions and goals will be reviewed, and the accomplishments toward them celebrated.

Working Sessions 2

February 2009 - The Way Forward

Next year, a second set of **Working Sessions** will be convened to review and celebrate the accomplishments of the first year of activity and to set a new agenda based on new priorities.

I would just like to let membership know that I had a chance to attend a Membership Code Workshop on Feb. 4th in Nanaimo.

We started the workshop at 9:30 am the stayed there until 3:00 pm. This was a very interesting workshop held by Woodward & Company, a Law Corporation out of Victoria. The Nanaimo Bands new Chief and Council allowed us to use their boardroom free of charge. I brought back some information for Chief & Council and the Band Manager to review.

I learned that Indian Affairs has no say on First Nations that are under Section 10 of the Indian Act, on how the Membership Rules are amended and Ehattesaht is under Section 10. First Nations, that are under Section 10 of the Indian Act, don't have to send the amendments of the Membership Rules to Indian Affairs for Approval. Woodward's and Company didn't think that there would be a good turn out for this workshop, but there was. Leah Mack of Ahousaht – was the host of this workshop and her team was Dawn Imlach – who graduated out of Carihi School, Jack Woodward and Drew Mildon.

I would like to thank Darlene for allowing me to attend this workshop.


