BAND COUNCIL RESOLUTION



WHEREAS, Ehattesaht/Chinehkint First Nation is faced with the spread of the Covid-19, a virus that had caused the government of British Columbia to declare a state of emergency and the World Health Organization to declare a global pandemic;

WHEREAS, Ehattesaht/Chinehkint First Nation has enacted the *Infectious Disease Response By-law* for the timely and effective response to infectious disease outbreaks in order to protect Ehattesaht/Chinehkint First Nation and its reserve lands and members;

WHEREAS Chief and Council has determined that recent Covid-19 cases and outbreaks in proximity to the Ehattesaht/Chinehkint First Nation community poses a serious threat to the Nation and its members;

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED that Chief and Council:

- 1. issues a Declaration of Disease Emergency under section 4 of the *Infectious Disease Response By-law* (the "By-law");
- 2. enacts the Order appended as Schedule "A" to this Resolution pursuant to section 12 of the *By-law*; and
- 3. Appoints Road Monitors holding JIBC Basic Security Training certification as Officers under the meaning of the *Bylaw* (In addition, an RCMP Officer is an "Officer" under the *Bylaw*).

Schedule "A"

ORDER #1 OF THE COUNCIL OF THE EHATTESAHT/CHINEHKINT FIRST NATION

Respecting COVID-19 Response

(Pursuant to Sections 4, 7-22 of the In	fectious Disease Response By-law No. 2020-

TO: EHATTESAHT/CHINEHKINT FIRST NATION MEMBERS, OTHER RESIDENTS ON RESERVE LANDS, AND VISITORS

WHEREAS:

- 1. On March 17, 2020 the Provincial Health Officer of British Columbia provided notice under section 52(2) of the *Public Health Act* that the transmission of the infectious agent SARS-CoV-2, which has caused cases and outbreaks of Covid-19 among the population of the Province of British Columbia, constitutes a regional event as defined in section 51 of the *Public Health Act* (the "Emergency");
- 2. The Provincial Health Officer has issued various orders in respect of Covid-19 response under the authority of the *Public Health Act*;
- 3. Chief and Council has determined that the Emergency constitutes an ongoing risk of harm to the health of the Ehattesaht/Chinehkint First Nation community, and has issued a Declaration of Disease Emergency under the *Infectious Disease Response By-law*;
- 4. Chief and Council has determined that timely and effective response to Covid-19 requires coordination of Ehattesaht/Chinehkint's response with that of the Province of British Columbia.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Ehattesaht/Chinehkint First Nation hereby exercises the powers in sections 4, 7-22 of the *Infectious Disease Response By-law No. 2020-_____* ("By-law") to order as follows:

- 1. that, subject to section 2 below, all orders of the British Columbia Provincial Health Officer relating to Covid-19 response that are enacted from time to time, including those orders listed in "Appendix A", together with any updates or amendments to those orders, as well as the Travel Directive at "Appendix B" are incorporated by reference in this Order and made part of this Order and apply on Ehattesaht/Chinehkint reserve lands;
- 2. that, to the extent of any inconsistency between the terms of orders of the British Columbia Provincial Health Officer incorporated in accordance with section 1 and the terms of the Bylaw or any Ehattesaht/Chinehkint Order issued pursuant to the By-law, the terms of the Bylaw or Ehattesaht/Chinehkint Order, as the case may be, will prevail;

This Order will be in effect until expiration or cancellation of the Declaration of Disease Emergency
or the earlier cancellation of the Order in accordance with the Infectious Disease Response By-law
No. 2020

COVID-19 MANDATORY TRAVEL DIRECTIVE FOR EHATTESAHT/CHINEHKINT APRIL 9th 2020

WHEREAS: The world health organization has announced COVID-19 pandemic on March 11, 2020;

WHEREAS: On March 18, 2020 the Province of BC declared a Provincial State of Emergency, extended on March 31, 2020 and ECFN implemented the Emergency Management Plan (EMP) on March 20;

WHEREAS: Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a respiratory disease that can result in mild or severe symptoms including fever, cough, shortness of breath and can lead to serious illness or death particularly in the case of Elders and persons with serious chronic medical conditions;

WHEREAS: There are cases of COVID-19 on North, Mid and South Vancouver Island;

WHEREAS: ECFN Territory, including the Ehatis/Zeballos area, is a vulnerable, isolated community with:

- Extremely limited health resources;
- Extremely limited health personnel;
- Limited emergency response resources;
- Limits on adequate housing and local access to food and provisions;
- No cellular service and low bandwidth internet;
- Existing health and medical challenges within the population; and
- Long distance from adequate medical services.

WHEREAS: As a result, the ECFN community is uniquely vulnerable to COVID-19 transmission and urgent measures are required for the protection, health, and safety of ECFN Elders, members, and community residents:

THEREFORE, EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY and UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE:

NON-LOCAL RESIDENTS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO TRAVEL TO OR THROUGH ECFN
COMMUNITY. If you are not a local resident of ECFN, Nuchatlaht, Kyuquot or Village of
Zeballos you will be turned away. There may be applicable exceptions including some
essential services staff, delivery of goods, services and medical/emergency personnel;

- BUSINESS TRAVEL THROUGH the ECFN community and work within the ECFN Territory will be evaluated on a case by case basis. Proponents will be required to submit COVID Safety plans for review and approval;
- THIS DIRECTIVE APPLIES TO ALL FORMS OF TRAVEL, including but not limited to Vehicle, Quad, Motorcycle, Boat, Plane, Helicopter, Ferry, Foot, Bicycle, or any other form of travel or conveyance;
- MEMBERS OR OTHER PERSONS NOT ORDINARILY RESIDENT IN THE COMMUNITY SHOULD NOT TRAVEL to the community but should instead remain where they normally reside and follow the local authority's COVID-19 safety guidelines;
- MEMBERS OR OTHER PERSONS NOT ORDINARILY RESIDENT IN THE COMMUNITY but have
 to travel to and stay within the community as a requirement for their job (which must be a
 designated essential service) may do so under the following conditions:
 - They have been self-isolation for 14 days prior to arrival
 - They have travelled safely to the community
 - The lodging where they will reside has submitted and received approval for a Covid-19 Guest Safety protocol which has an isolation plan included.
 - The company with whom they are employed has an approved Covid-19 safety plan with the Nation;
 - o These conditions will apply to each shift change and for each new employee.
- RESIDENTS who have been outside the community visiting areas where known Covid-19 cases have been reported will be allowed into the community. However, they will be required to adhere to a 14-day quarantine (self-isolation) period;
- ALL ECFN MEMBERS AND RESIDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO PRACTICE PHYSICAL DISTANCING
 AT ALL TIMES and observe instructions at public spaces. Washing your hands, not touching
 your face, disinfecting surfaces that are frequently touched, and reporting to the
 appropriate health authorities if you present symptoms consistent with a developing Covid19 illness.
- ALL ECFN MEMBERS AND RESIDENTS WILL FOLLOW The Ehattesaht COVID-19 PANDEMIC PLAN and all Directives, Decisions and Recommendations pursuant to the PLAN.
- THIS DIRECTIVE, TOGETHER WITH THE EMP, takes the place of all previous Declarations and Directives by ECFN Chief and Council
